Resolution #16-19

IMPLEMENTATION OF APPROACHES TO COMMUNITY WELLBEING

WHEREAS, Resolution #15-03 Approval of the Approaches to Community Wellbeing and Resolution #15-04 Approval of the Transition Plan for Approaches to Community Wellbeing directed the Sioux Lookout First Nations Health Authority (SLFNHA) to seek funding to continue the Approaches to Community Wellbeing and develop implementation plans and formal agreements with Health Canada, Ministry of Health and Long Term Care, local public health units, and other potential funders; and

WHEREAS, the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care (MOHLTC) has announced a three-year funding plan for public health planning, public health services, and public health nursing; and

WHEREAS, the Approaches to Community Wellbeing team are ready to implement aspects of the system with that funding; and

WHEREAS, SLFNHA is prepared to continue to negotiate for additional funding, including from the First Nations Inuit Health Branch (FNIHB) and MOHLTC; and

WHEREAS, SLFNHA is prepared to negotiate for public health services to be transitioned from FNIHB, to implement Approaches to Community Wellbeing;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Chiefs in Assembly direct SLFNHA to begin the implementation of the Approaches to Community Wellbeing.
